A CHANGE OF COMMAND

In 2011, Soldiers & Sailors saw a change of command with the election of a new President and Board of Directors.

In May 2011, President Ron Gancas announced his retirement after working for thirteen years at Soldiers & Sailors. At its May meeting, the Board of Directors passed a motion for John F. McCabe to succeed as President & CEO beginning July 1, 2011. It was also passed that Ron Gancas stay on the board with the new honorary title, President Emeritus, as an award for his continued dedication and support of the organization.

As Soldiers & Sailors looks to its next one hundred years, it is led by newly elected President John F. McCabe. He previously served as Executive Vice President, is a retired US Army Reserve Major, and a graduate of Penn State and Duquesne University School of Law. He is also a member of the Allegheny County Bar Association's Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Soldiers & Sailors also elected new officers for its Board of Directors, which is comprised of community members, individuals appointed from veteran organizations, and local political leaders. The board works with staff and administration to raise awareness of the organization and its mission. Members support programs and events, help build partnerships, and approve important initiatives.

Mr. Ralph Ussack was elected as Chairperson. Ussack, a Marine veteran, has served on our board as a community member for more than five years. Michael Murphy, who serves as Executive Assistant in Allegheny County's Department of Veteran Services and was appointed to our board by the American Legion, will serve as Vice-Chairperson. President Emeritus Ron Gancas will serve as Treasurer, and Paul Platek, an Army veteran who has served on our board since Soldiers & Sailors became a nonprofit more than ten years ago, will serve as secretary.

1910 -1999 PART II - ANNIVERSARY SERIES

The early years of Soldiers & Sailors were simple and defined mainly by necessity. From 1910-1999, Soldiers & Sailors was run by a Board of Managers that oversaw operation, rentals and rules and regulations. Allegheny County provided capital and services necessary to run and maintain the building. Any memorabilia, artifacts, books or records obtained by the museum were stacked in the basement or shelved for posterity.

For the first thirty years of its existence, guests only visited Soldiers & Sailors to see the grand memorial, its Civil War memorial plaques or to attend events. As time continued, Soldiers & Sailors slowly became the repository of the artifacts of a dying generation. It was briefly managed by the Spanish-American War Veterans, then World War I and so on as time passed.

During this time period many noteworthy events occurred. Staff created exhibit cases to display donated artifacts that had been in storage. The climactic cage and escape scene from the 1991 movie, *Silence of the Lambs*, was filmed in the ballroom and the University of Pittsburgh's underground parking garage was constructed.

In 1963, the Allegheny County Board of Managers established the Hall of Valor program to honor Allegheny County veterans who were awarded for heroic actions during times of military conflict. The Hall of Valor program remains a critical tool in executing the memorial's mission.

As with many aging buildings, this once proud institution slowly fell from grace. Capital needs increased and eventually because of county budget restraints, repairs were only made reactively in emergency situations rather than maintaining and caring for the building.

In the nineties, Soldiers & Sailors was the subject of several newspaper articles that detailed the neglect and underuse of the building and its financial strain on Allegheny County. In order to assist both the memorial and the county, privatization was suggested as a solution. In 1999, a new dream was born for the memorial. A new governing trust was developed and the break from Allegheny County was set in place. Director Joseph Dugan and Assistant Director Ron Gancas launched Soldiers & Sailors on a new course for the twenty-first century.

Dear Friends,



In July 2011, Ron Gancas retired as President & CEO of Soldiers & Sailors after 13 years of dedicated leadership and passionate employment, including 6 years as our President. I began my new leadership role intent on keeping this place we call "the Hall" progressing in the direction our past leaders have taken. Our goal and mission remains the same.

Now, as we close out 2011 and welcome 2012, we are seeing the end of major military operations in Iraq, and beginning to see the same in Afghanistan. Many of our brave men and women will return home for good. Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hall & Museum Trust, Inc. is ready to welcome them, recognize them, and honor them, just as those veterans were recognized and honored in 1910; and just as they were with every other new generation of veterans since then. That has not changed and never will.

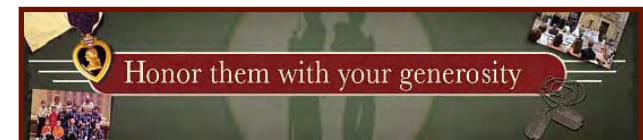

During the VIP reception following the Cannon Ball Military Follies Revue on October 16, 2011, Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hall & Museum Trust, Inc. recognized the Honorable Michael E. McCarthy of the Court of Common Pleas Fifth Judicial District Civil Division with the 2011 Friend & Patriot of the Year award. As a former Navy Seabee, Judge McCarthy is familiar with the trials and tribulations faced by those who have served and are serving our country. Judge McCarthy has graciously donated his time and effort to support Soldiers & Sailors and spread awareness of its mission. He was instrumental in starting the veteran court program in Allegheny County which emphasizes treatment over punishment.

"As a veteran, I am keenly aware and supportive of the mission of Soldiers and Sailors; to remember and pay tribute to all who have served our great country in times of war," said the Honorable Michael E. McCarthy. "I am honored and humbled to be chosen as Friend and Patriot of the Year."

2012 HALL OF VALOR INDUCTIONS

The Joseph A. Dugan, Jr. Hall of Valor program has been active since the 1960s and honors veterans from across the state that have gone above and beyond during times of military conflict. Currently, more than 600 veterans have been inducted who are recipients of The Congressional Medal of Honor, The Kearny Cross, Distinguished Service Cross, Navy Cross, Air Force Cross, Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross and Soldier's Medal. The Hall of Valor is open to veterans who were born, enlisted, or lived most of their lives in Pennsylvania.

The next induction ceremony will occur on Sunday, March 25, 2012. In order to be considered for this class of inductions, applications must be received by February 1, 2012. For more information or to apply or nominate an honoree, please contact Casey Patterson.

Helpful Event Hints ENHANCING WITHOUT OVERPOWERING

As a century old historical landmark and architectural marvel constructed by world renowned architect Henry Hornbostel, Soldiers & Sailors is one of Oakland's shining jewels, as well as one of her best kept secrets.

The grand ballroom, one of the building's greatest treasures, exudes a sense of effortlessly elegant grandeur with a kiss of old world charm. Visitors are overwhelmed with its dramatic and ornately detailed high ceiling. Exquisite craftsmanship of this magnitude is unparalleled in modern architecture. While this one of a kind space impresses guests, some clients choose to enhance its elaborate ceiling by cascading various decorative elements across the ballroom's grand balcony.

Our versatile venue boasts a simple yet sophisticated color scheme, which does not rival bold, vibrant décor. This allows for the use of a wide variety of colors and materials. Adding a few objects helps to customize the space creating drama and visual interest.

Many brides have strung festive paper lanterns in many shades such as fuchsia, lavender, rose and snow using heavy duty fishing line, giving the impression that the lanterns float in midair in the evening light. Other brides have hired engineers to drape lit tapestries over the balcony in rich colors such as wine, gold, cherry, cream and plum. One crafty bride purchased gossamer draping and simple string lights to create and hang her own tapestries, appearing comparable to high end professional work.

AND THE AWARD GOES TO...

The Education department at Soldiers & Sailors has continually improved and expanded since its inception in 2000. This year, its efforts were recognized by the community and both of our staff members earned prestigious awards.

In October, Director of Education Tim Neff received the "Friend of Social Studies" award at the Pennsylvania Council for the Social Studies' 58th Annual Conference and in November, Historian John L. Ford, Sr. was named by The New Pittsburgh Courier as one of its "Men of Excellence."

Neff was presented the "Friend of Social Studies" award at the opening reception of the Pennsylvania Council for the Social Studies' 58th Annual Conference on October 13. This special award is awarded to a non-teaching professional in the state of Pennsylvania who is dedicated to the promotion of Social Studies education, exhibits conscientious interest and involvement, has furthered the interest of social studies teaching and studies interest in Pennsylvania and is particularly supportive of the Pennsylvania Council for the Social Studies. As the fifth recipient of the award, Neff was the first honoree that does not hold a political office. Neff has been working as the Director of Education at Soldiers & Sailors for more than nine years.

The New Pittsburgh Courier honored Ford at a special reception at the Fairmont Hotel on October 27, 2011. Ford was among 50 African-American men from our region who have made significant contributions to the community and business world. The "Men of Excellence" represent individuals who have exemplified strength by standing firm in the face of adversity, leadership in periods of struggle, compassion in times of peril, and integrity in the midst of opposition. Ford is among a prestigious list of educators, activists, former athletes, politicians and others who all serve as role models to the community. Ford joined Soldiers & Sailors three years ago as a part-time Historian after retiring from the Senator John Heinz History Center.

INSIDE THE EXHIBITS

WITH OUR CURATOR



Since its opening day in 1910, Soldiers & Sailors has been a place of memory, and for one hundred years donations of artifacts from military families have come into the museum and have been displayed to interpret the story of military service.

While visiting the museum, guests enjoy many touching and personal artifacts. Most recently the addition of a showcase dedicated to those who served in Iraq and Afghanistan has brought our current time to be interpreted. The display showcase contains uniforms worn

in the conflict, as well as a selection of gear and material used by two local soldiers, Captain Mathew Bocian and SGT Dan Kysela.

Shortly after the display was finished a recently returned Afghanistan veteran, SGT Daniel Bailes of the 28th Infantry Division C Company 1-110th Infantry Regiment, stopped by to ask whether we would display a small memorial flag which had hung in his tent.

The flag, or more properly guidon, is swallowtail shaped with embroidered wording and insignia applied to its desert sand colored body. Stitched onto the flag is the Keystone patch of the 28th ID along with the patch of the 82nd Airborne. Along the

top reads "In Memory of" and at the bottom "SFC Robert Fike and SSG Bryan Hoover." The two Pennsylvania soldiers were in SGT Bailes Company, and were both regrettably killed in an explosion triggered by a teenage suicide bomber on June 10, 2011. Bailes explained that Hoover and Fike were best friends and were killed together while on patrol.

SGT Bailes' request to display this memorial guidon was easy to honor. Our mission here at Soldiers and Sailors is to remember the service of our troops past and present. The names and the memory of Hoover and Fike join the ranks of other Pennsylvania soldiers recorded here who gave their all.



SANTA CLAUS VISITED CIVIL WAR SOLDIERS

The Christmas of 1862 marks the debut of the modern version of Santa Claus in American culture. Thomas Nast who was considered the "Father of the American Cartoon" created the icon's appearance. Nast based his version off Clement Moore's 1823 book *A Visit from St. Nicholas*, also known as *The Night before Christmas*.

With Moore's description of Santa Claus' physical appearance integrated with Nast's native German tradition of St. Nicholas (a fourth century bishop known for kindness and generosity) the likeness of Santa Claus was portrayed as we know it today. Nast's Santa Claus appeared on the Saturday, January 3, 1863 cover of

Harper's Weekly, which is a part of the vast collection of *Harper's Weekly* magazines housed at Soldiers & Sailors. The kind, warm-hearted figure representing Christmas is shown with a long beard wearing a shirt covered with stars and handing boxes to Union soldiers at a campsite. The boxes included items such as a meerschau pipe, stockings with various items inside, and even a jack in the box for the drummer boy. Thomas Nast invented the image of Santa Claus to memorialize family and the sacrifices of the Union during the Civil War. However, the use of Claus was depressing at first because Nast was saddened by the separation between soldiers and family.

Although it was not yet a national holiday, Christmas was normally a traditional festival celebration during the era of the Civil War. For the soldiers in camp, this time of year was celebrated with festivities and entertaining events. Men would play amusing games such as trying to climb greased poles or chase after grease-covered pigs. The modern American celebration of Christmas involving gift exchanging was developed in larger cities such as New York after 1880.

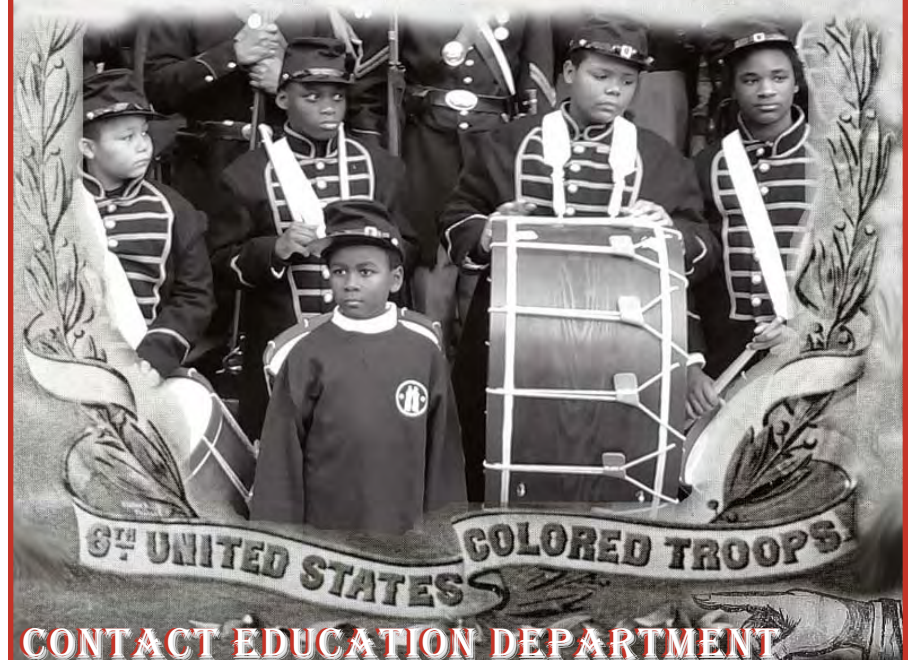
